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### **ABOUT THE PRODUCT**

#### RAMPBALL®

Rampball® is a spring mounted balance ball. The product is designed for use by all age groups in public spaces meant for play and physical activity, like schoolyards, urban spaces, parks etc. The product is delivered in 4 versions; tilting versions with 35 or 50 cm dimeter, and tilting and rotating versions with 50 or 70 cm diameter.

#### **MOUNTING**

Rampball<sup>®</sup> can be mounted on different kinds of ground covers (grass, artificial grass, wet pour and loose fill covers).

This description is for mounting on grass and loose fill covers.

Mounting time approx 30-45 min, 1 person.

#### **SAFETY**

The device requires a shock absorbing ground cover approved for a 100 cm fall height, according to  $EN\ 1176-1:2017\ /\ 4.2.8.5.3$ 

The product is certified by TÜV according to EN 1176-1:2017 and EN 16630:2015

#### **INCLUSIVE DESIGN**

The product is designed to be accessible and fun for all users, including users with disabilities.

Rampline recommends using a ground cover that does not obstruct anyone in accessing the device. Avoid edges or steps etc. that may pose hindrances for some users. Read more about inclusive design and our products at rampline.com.

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## **SAFETY ZONE AND DISTANCES**


#### **SAFETY ZONE**

Rampball® requires a safety zone within 150 cm distance from the device. It can share safety zone with other equipment.

#### REQUIRED DISTANCES BETWEEN RAMPBALLS

Multiple Rampballs can be placed in groups and courses according to EN 1176-1:2017 / 3.20 .

Required distances between Rampballs, see the drawing below wich states minimum distances (center to center) between balls of different sizes.




## **CASTING THE CONCRETE FOUNDATION**

#### **IMPORTANT:**


- Use concrete grade minimum B30
- · Never make the foundation smaller than the minimum required size.
- Even the concrete with a trowel to get a smooth surface at the attachment point.
- Let the concrete harden for at least 7 days before attaching the device to the foundation.

## **MOUNTED RAMPBALL®**


The mounted Rampball® should look like this:



### ATTACHING THE SPRING ASSEMBLY




Insert the spring assembly into the ball.



## Find the right position in order for the bolts to match the holes in the ball.


2 bolts with washers and locking washers (3 bolts for version Rampball® 70R).



#### For versions with rotation:

(Rampball® 50R and Rampball® 70R):

It is important that the spring assembly's mounting plate and the mounting plate at the bottom of the ball are placed in the correct position relative to each other. The plates should fit tight together.



#### Insert the bolts and tighten them properly.

Use a 19 mm socket wrench (22 mm for Rampball 70R) with an extender.

To obtain enough force, sit on the ball and pinch the spring assembly betweeen the legs.


## **MOUNTING ON GRASS**

#### The mounting is performed in 3 steps


- 1) Cast the foundation
- 2) Attach the mounting bracket to the foundatiion
- 3) Attach the device on the mounting bracket

#### **Equipment needed:**

Small sledgehammer • Hammer drill with 10 mm bit (12 mm for Rampball 70R) • Measuring tape
 Included: • Socket wrench 17 mm • Steel pipe




#### MOUNTING




Place the mounting bracket with the PE-ring on foundation's center.

Drill holes and fasten the 4 legs of the mounting bracket to the concrete foundation using the supplied expansion bolts.




Place the Rampball carefully into the PE ring with the bolts in position to match the bolt holes.

(With the largest version Rampball 70R, 2 persons are required. Use a pallet jack trolley or other lifting aid.)




#### Check before fastening.

Check that the Rampball is standing straight in 90 degrees. The flange should fit inside the PE ring. If the U-bolt is visible through the hole on the side of the rubber flange the device is correctly positioned.




Install the washers, lock washers and the nuts on the 4 bolts and tighten.

Lift the rubber flange for access. When washers and nuts are attached, lower the flange back into position.




#### Attach the rubber flange to the PE ring.

Screw the 2 supplied screws into the pre-drilled holes of the ring. The screws should go through the PE ring as well as through the wall of the rubber flange.



Fill with draining gravel, soil and apply grass on top.



#### Rampball is now fully mounted.

Top up soil layer to the edge of the PE ring after some time if it has sinked.


# MOUNTING ON LOOSE FILL COVERS

#### The mounting is performed in 4 steps


- 1) Cast the foundation
- 2) Attach the mounting bracket
- 3) Mount the device to the mounting bracket
- 4) Fill with shock absorbing aggregates

#### **Equipment needed:**

Small sledgehammer
 Hammer drill with 10 mm bit
 Measuring tape
 Included:
 Socket wrench 17 mm
 Steel pipe




#### MOUNTING




Place the mounting bracket with the PE-ring on foundation's center.

Drill holes and fasten the 4 legs of the mounting bracket to the concrete foundation using the supplied expansion bolts.




Place the Rampball carefully into the PE ring with the bolts in position to match the bolt holes.

(With the largest version Rampball 70R, 2 persons are required. Use a pallet jack trolley or other lifting aid.)




#### Check before fastening.

Check that the Rampball is standing straight in 90 degrees. The flange should fit inside the PE ring. If the U-bolt is visible through the hole on the side of the rubber flange the device is correctly positioned.




Install the washer, lock washer and the nut on the 4 bolts and tighten.

Lift the rubber flange for access. When washers and nuts are attached, lower the flange back into position.



#### Attach the rubber flange to the PE ring.

Screw the 2 supplied screws into the pre-drilled holes of the ring. The screws should go through the PE ring as well as through the wall of the rubber flange.



Fill up with aggregates to the edge of the rubber flange.

Rampball is now fully mounted.

# MOUNTING ON WET POUR COVERS


#### The mounting is performed in 4 steps

- 1) Cast the foundation
- 2) Put the styrofoam placeholder in place
- 3) Pour the ground cover
- 4) Remove the placeholder and mount the device

#### **Equipment needed**

- · Small sledgehammer · Knife · Hammer drill with 10 mm bit (12 mm for Rampball 70R)
- Measuring tape


Included: • Socket wrench 17 mm • Steel pipe



#### WHEN POURING THE GROUND COVER

A mounting hole for the device must be prepared using the included styrofoam placeholder.


**Important!** The design of the device requires the thickness of the ground cover to be **6 cm**.



#### Before pouring the ground cover:

Place the styrofoam placeholder on the concrete foundation.

Put a stone or heavy weight on the placeholder to hold it in place.




## Pour the ground cover to level with the top of the placeholder.

The ground cover should have the same thickness as the placeholder (6 cm) at the mounting hole.

If desired the thickness can be tapered down to 5 cm at about 30 cm from the mounting hole.


#### **MOUNTIING**

After the ground cover is poured and cured.



#### Remove the placeholder.

Use a knife to pull it out of the mounting hole.




#### Drill 4 holes using the drill template.

Drill in a perpedicular angle into the concrete.

When the first hole is done, fix the drill template in position with the supplied steel pin (arrow).


Drill the 3 remaining holes.



#### Hammer down the expansion bolts.

The level of the top of the bolts should be 15 mm below the surface of the poured ground cover.


Use a small sledgehammer and be careful not to damage the bolts.



#### Adjust bolts if necessary.


Place the drill template on the bolts and check that they match the holes.

Correct the bolts if needed using the supplied steel pipe.




#### Attach large washers and spacers.

First clean away loose particles on the concrete surface around the bolts.




Place the Rampball carefully into the mounting hole with the bolt holes in position to match the bolts.

(With the largest version Rampball 70R, 2 persons are required. Use a pallet jack trolley or other lifting aid.)



#### Check before fastening.

Check that the Rampball is standing straight in 90 degrees. The flange should fit easily inside the mounting hole and rest on the ground. If the U-bolt is visible through the hole on the side of the rubber flange the device is correctly positioned.



## Install the washer, lock washer and the nut on the 4 bolts and tighten.

Lift up the rubber flange for access. When washers and nuts are attached, lower the flange back into position.

Jumpstone is now fully mounted.

# MOUNTING ON ARTIFICIAL GRASS


#### The mounting is performed in 4 steps

- 1) Cast the foundation
- 2) Mount the PETG-ring on the foundation
- 3) Lay the artificial grass
- 4) Mount the device


#### **Equipment needed:**

- · Small sledgehammer · Hammer drill with 10 mm bit (12 mm for Rampball 70R)
- · Measuring tape · Wallpaper knife

Included: • Socket wrench 17 mm • Steel pipe




#### **MOUNTING**



## Attach the PETG-ring to the concrete foundation.


Drill 3 holes and use the included screws and plugs.



# Cut the shock absorbing layer along the outside edge of the PETG-ring.

Lay the mat tight to the PETG-ring.


Use a sharp wallpaper knife.




# Cut the artificial grass layer along the outside edge of the PETG-ring.

Lay the artificial grass tight to the plastic shield.

Use a sharp wallpaper knife .



The mounting hole is now ready for mounting the Rampball.




#### Drill 4 holes using the drill template.

Drill in a perpedicular angle into the concrete.

When the first hole is done, fix the drill template in position with the supplied steel pin (arrow).


Drill the 3 remaining holes.



#### Hammer down the expansion bolts.

The level of the top of the bolts should be **15 mm below** the surface of the poured ground cover.


Use a small sledgehammer and be careful not to damage the bolts.



#### Adjust bolts if necessary.


Place the drill template on the bolts and check that they match the holes.

Correct the bolts if needed using the supplied steel pipe.




#### Attach large washers and spacers.

First clean away loose particles on the concrete surface around the bolts.




Place the Rampball carefully into the mounting hole with the bolt holes in position to match the bolts.

(With the Rampball 70R, 2 persons are required. Use a pallet jack trolley or other lifting aid.)



#### Check before fastening.

Check that the Rampball is standing straight in 90 degrees. The rubber flange should fit easily inside the PETG-ring. If the U-bolt is visible through the hole on the side of the rubber flange the device is correctly positioned.



Install the washer, lock washer and the nut on the 4 bolts and tighten.

Lift up the rubber flange for access. When washers and nuts are attached, lower the rubber flange back into position.

Rampball is now fully mounted.
